

Intestate Probate Settlement of Walter Walker

Walter Walker was a man who was born in the 1700's. He probably had 3 wives, two that died before he did. He died intestate (meaning he had no will).

However, he had enough property that there were probate proceedings. This is one of the key paragraphs from the proceedings:

(State of Indiana, Owen County, Probate Court, May Term 1852, Walter Walker Estate)
Extract: "Balance against administrator 53.08, which sum is to be divided among the heirs, and widow of said deceased as follows, Anna Walker the widow is entitled to, \$17.69. the amount due each one of the heirs is 4.42 $\frac{3}{8}$. The said administrator reports that the names of the children of said deceased are as follows, to wit: William Walker, (who is dead & his heirs names are unknown), Edward Walker, Ruth Walker, Pheobe Owen, Annie Allee, Rhoda Cain, Francis Walker, & Sarah Taylor. The said administrator now files the following receipts, to wit: Rhoda Cain's receipt for 4.42 $\frac{3}{8}$. Job Allee for Anna Allee his wife 4. 42 $\frac{3}{8}$. Dan. Owen for Phebe Owen his wife 4.42 $\frac{3}{8}$. Anna Walker (widow) 17.69. The said administrator now pays into court, the amount due the heirs of William Walker, also amount due Edward Walker, Ruth Walker, Francis Walker, & Sarah Taylor, amounting together to \$22.11 $\frac{7}{8}$. Making total amount \$53.08. Said administrator reports that he has fully administered said estate so far as assets have come into his hands, & he asks to be discharged from further duties as such. Respectfully submitted. Job Allee admin. Subscribed & sworn to in open court May 11th, 1852 I. C. Johnson, clerk"
